This class is for anyone interested in learning how to do simple vehicle maintenance and repairs; such as oil changes, proper lubricating, cooling, tire changes and handling other emergency situations. Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Prep

This course is designed to assist people preparing to take the written exam for a Commercial Driver's License. The course covers rules, regulations, laws, and safety standards for any type of commercial driver's license.

School Bus Certification

Must be age 18 or older, have a valid driver's license, and a Class B CDL with passenger and "S" endorsement OR Permit. Per Department of Transportation regulations, everyone testing for a CDL will be required to obtain a commercial learner's permit. They will be required to hold the permit for 14 days before they are eligible to take the skills test.

This course covers legal controls, emergency procedures, student behavior management, defensive driving, bus loading, railroad crossing safety, vehicle inspection, emergency evacuation, still maneuvers and over-the-road driving. Students must attend all hours of instruction and pass the CDL test at the Department of Motor Vehicles prior to course completion (cost not included in tuition.) The CDL drive test will be available. If the drive test is not needed, \$20 will be deducted from tuition at registration.

Health Services

Certified Medication Aide (CMA)

Student must provide a copy of their current Nurse Aide Certification card in LTC, HH, or DDCA issued by the Oklahoma State Department of Health. Must be 18 years of age or older, have a high school diploma or GED, and be licensed and currently employed as a CNA for the past six months. Results of a current (within the last 12 months) TB skin test are required at the time of enrollment.

This course is for the Certified Nurse Aide. A Medication Aide is allowed to perform the administration of medication in the following settings: long-term care facilities, facilities for the developmentally disabled, residential care facilities, and adult day care facilities. Tuition includes book and state certification exam.

Issues dealing with patient contact, medical ethics, and legal problems will be discussed. Anatomy and physiology of the vascular system as they pertain to Phlebotomy will be reviewed.

Nursing skills are taught in the nursing laboratory, with clinical experience being provided through on-the-job training in nursing homes and hospitals. Tuition includes books, state certification testing, Healthcare Provider CPR, and Home Health Aide certification.

Tri County Frequently Asked Questions

When and how do I enroll?

- You may enroll as soon as our catalog arrives in your mailbox.
- Full payment is required to enroll.
- Enrollment may be done by calling 918-333-2422. Please have your MasterCard or Visa ready so your tuition fee can be processed at that time.
- Go online to our homepage at www.tctc.org and click the link that says SHORT-TERM COURSES, then select COURSE SCHEDULE/ENROLL NOW, then CLICK HERE. Click the courses you want to enroll in and click SUBMIT. At this time you will need to follow the registration process. Tuition payment can be made by using a MasterCard or Visa.
- If paying with cash or check, you will need to enroll in person at the main campus located at 6101 SE Nowata Road in Bartlesville.

When is the enrollment deadline?

There is not a specific enrollment deadline. Most classes have limited enrollment and fill quickly. If there are still spaces available, you may enroll up until the start time of the class.

Are books included in the cost of the tuition?

Books are typically included in the tuition and are handed out the first night of class. To ensure that you will have a book the first night, you will need to be enrolled two weeks before the first night of class.

Why are classes canceled?

If a class does not have enough students to cover the cost of our expenses then the class may be moved back a few weeks to start at a later time or canceled. Prevent class cancellations – Enroll Early!

Is financial aid available?

- Short-term classes are not eligible for Pell Grants through FAFSA.
- There are a limited number of Foundation Scholarships based on financial need. A form must be filled out and turned in with the latest tax return or one month of current pay stubs for every one in the household who is working. The maximum the scholarship will pay is ½ the tuition cost. The other ½ must be paid by the student in order to enroll.

Are there any extra costs?

Some classes do require an additional cost. Scrubs, OSBI background check, and a TB skin test are required for some medical courses.

Are there any discounts?

Any citizen of Tri County Technology Center's district who is sixty (60) years of age or older may receive a 20% discount on any course.

Member to Member discount for Bartlesville Chamber of Commerce Members is 20%. Only one discount per enrollment.

I'm enrolled, can I cancel?

- Cancellations before the class starts are issued a 100% refund. Enrollments canceled before the second class meeting, will be refunded, less a \$25.00 fee.
- Refunds will not be issued after the second meeting of any class, regardless
 of attendance.
- No refunds will be issued if the course tuition is \$25.00 or less.

What are the office hours?

- The office is open Monday through Thursday 8:00 am 9:00 pm and Friday 8:00 am – 4 pm, except holidays.
- We will be closed January 1-3, January 20, February 17, March 17-21, April 18 and May 26.
